Eynesbury College is a pre-university pathway college located in Adelaide, South Australia. We offer a range of programs which allow students to study at either the Senior High School, Foundation or Diploma level. Eynesbury offers amongst the most comprehensive range of pathway programs in South Australia, which provides maximum flexibility in assisting students to gain entry to their chosen degree pathway and in preparing them for academic success at University. Eynesbury programs lead into The University of Adelaide or the University of South Australia bachelor degree programs.

Eynesbury has two campuses, both located in the centre of Adelaide city, near the Chinatown and Central Market precinct. Our modern, purpose built Coglein Street campus is home to our English language, Diploma and Foundation Studies programs, while our Franklin Street campus is for our Senior High School.
